Register On-line for our UU Children's RE Program

Steps for a Healthy RE Program

- Children age 2 and under will remain with their caregivers. We have a quiet family area at the back right of the sanctuary. The service can also be viewed in our foyer, or listened to in our Fellowship Hall, which has a kids' corner.
 Ages 3-11 RE programming will be held outdoors through the month of October.
- ~Shared snacks will be avoided.
- ~In November, we will transition to indoor classes
- if the health risks from Covid-19 are acceptable at that time. If not, we will resume online Sunday lessons based on Sunday morning's story for preschool-6th grade students, and provide unstructured supervision on
- Sunday morning for those families who choose to attend.
- ~Masks will be worn indoors at all times, and we will use ventilated spaces, hand sanitizer, and social distancing whenever possible.
- ~Classrooms will be disinfected between class sessions.
- ~Volunteer teachers must provide proof of vaccination.*

Children's Religious Education: 2021-2022

Fall/Winter 2021

Preschool-K

Our preschool-kindergarten children will begin the year with simple games, crafts, and free play as they regain their sense of comfort in our UU space and enjoy time together. This freeform and welcoming environment is intended to enhance their feelings of safety and security within our UU community in particular, and amongst others in our world in general.

Grade 1-3

The *Love will Guide Us* curriculum, our 1st-3rd graders will learn to seek guidance in life through the lens of our Unitarian Universalist Sources, with an emphasis on love. Sessions apply wisdom from our Sources to help participants answer some important questions. Participants will learn that asking questions is valued in Unitarian Universalism, even as they begin to shape their own answers to life's big questions.

Grades 4-6

We will be offering the middle elementary portion of the UUA *Our Whole Lives* Sexuality program to our fourth-sixth graders. This program will help our 4th-5th graders to gain the knowledge, life principles, and skills they need to understand and express their sexuality in holistic, life-enhancing ways. A parent orientation will be held beforehand and participation in the program is voluntary.

Jr/Sr High School Youth Group

This year will begin with our junior and senior high youth becoming reacquainted and processing the past year as a youth community. When they are ready, they will begin to discuss the curriculum, *A Place of Wholeness*, which will help our youth explore what it means to be Unitarian Universalist. Our youth need practice in describing our multifaceted faith in terms that are personally meaningful and true. This curriculum also encourages youth to look inward for a clearer understanding of their personal faith and guides them to express that faith outward into the world.

Winter/Spring 2022:

Preschool

Our preschoolers will engage with the *Chalice Children* curriculum, exploring our Unitarian Universalist faith. It strives not just to teach about our faith, but also to provide experiences around the strength of community, the wonder and awe that transcend everyday understanding, and life issues we all share.

Grade K-2

Our second session of RE, we will be offering the youngest level of the UUA's *Our Whole Lives* Sexuality program to our kindergartensecond graders. This level

educates our children about babies, bodies, birth, and families. A parent orientation will be held beforehand and participation in the program is voluntary.

Our K-2 children will end the year with The *Love Surrounds Us* curriculum, which will help our children explore the 7 Principles in the context of Beloved Community of family/home, school, and neighborhood. Participants engage in activities that emphasize the love they feel in community.

Grade 3-6

The *Toolbox of Faith* curriculum invites participants to reflect on qualities of our UU faith, such as integrity, courage and love, as tools they can use in living their lives and building their own faith. What tools does UU-ism offer for the challenges of life? Children discover what aspects of UU faith are helpful to them, developing a toolbox of faith.

Junior/Senior High Youth Group

Our senior high youth will continue on with our *A Place of Wholeness* curriculum exploring more in-depth how to talk about what it means to be Unitarian Universalist. Our youth will continue practicing how to describe our multifaceted faith in terms that are personally meaningful and true o them. Youth will look deeper inward for a clearer understanding of their personal faith and guides them to express that faith outward into the world.
