It was a pleasure to welcome our emeritus minister, the Rev. Michael Brown, and his wife, Diane, who were part of this congregation for 27 years. ## From the UU Church of Peoría Trust

As President of the UU Church of Peoria Trust, I want to lift up how well Steve Klister did a difficult job in response to the pandemic tanking investments for everyone and pushing our balances lower than total amounts ever donated! From the Trust's beginning in 1978 until 2022, trust officers had never seen anything that dipped low enough to create a zero distribution! And so we and the church were anguished by this outcome, and we trust officers set to rework our distribution formula to improve matters if this ever came to pass again! Steve stepped up to the plate, ran many spreadsheets and used his careful, iterative approach to lift up two primary solutions, which we discussed with this body and other stakeholders at length. And after significant analysis, the trust board voted to implement the changes. Steve described these and their purpose at the Spring Annual Church Meeting. First, the primary calculation formula would be three percent, so that it would not have dipped so low in 2022 if it recurred. And second, with careful modeling and an ear to the needs of the budget team and the church overall, Steve shared that the trust board had added a new commitment: to never distribute less than the prior year's distribution. I want to thank Steve for his valuable service around this time, and the trust officers look forward to continuing to build with our care and management of the Trust for the long-term future of the church—one gift of any amount at any time! Thank you, Steve! We are also glad Steve conducted an introductory training for the church board members so that they have solid info about how the Trust works and how it supports the church by careful management and reliably distributing the annual distribution, which just this month was \$20,613! Thank you!
