From the Catholic Social Activist, Dorothy Day: "We have all known the long loneliness, and we have learned that the only solution is love and that love comes with community."

Our summer services address everything from Superman, to wearable theology, to the non-human creatures in our lives. These months are times of losses as much as they open to possibilities. Even as school starts for many students, I invite us to continue to explore sources of inspiration and meaning in this summer-time.

My invitation has an additional purpose. We are called to meet this time in our lives with compassion for ourselves and a desire to create a more just and more whole world. 2025-26 RE for Children & Youth

Overview of Religious Education in 2025-26

On September 21, age-group classes will resume for Sunday Morning Children & Youth Religious Education. Here is a sneak peek of each class. See the church website for more details!

Nursery Care (birth-3 yrs) ~ Every week, we provide loving care in our Nursery for the youngest UUs among us.

Spirit Play (PreK-1st Grade) ~ Spirit Play uses storytelling, ritual, play, and creativity to help children explore their Unitarian Universalist faith. It is inspired by the Montessori method and focuses on fostering a child's individual search for truth and meaning.

Lego Values (2nd-4th Grade) ~ An introduction to UU Shared Values through storybooks, discussion, Legos, and play activities. In the second half of the year, we will use Mosaic Lifespan Anti-Racism Curriculum to provide age-appropriate learning about identity, culture, and building the beloved community.

Power of the People (5th-8th Grade) ~ We will investigate times in American History when others have taken action, discuss what values guided them, and let the past inspire our future. We will draw from the book *Rad American History A-Z* by Kate Schatz and Miriam Klein Stahl and art projects from Mint & Bloom.

Pathfinders (9th-12th Grade) ~ Our high school class will be finding their own path by building their UU identity through Games to Build Community and, later, by examining white supremacy culture, exploring indigenous wisdom, and planning a worship service for our whole community.

Our Whole Lives: Lifespan Sexuality Curriculum ~ This year, we plan to run three sessions of OWL: Grades 5-6 Fall 2025 ~ Grades K-1 Winter 2026 ~ Grades 10-11 Spring 2026

With political division becoming more pronounced, it can be difficult to cut through the noise and

really listen to people talking to us about deeply felt issues and concerns. Building common ground and empathy is one way to open up dialogue with friends, family, and our community to change people's opinions on sometimes difficult topics. In this series, we will learn more about ourselves, our personal history, and how to use personal storytelling to bridge divided communities by creating a platform for empathy.

Annual Campaign Update



We Rose to the Moment!

The church's 2025-26 Annual Campaign was a success by many measures!

- 180 families or individuals made a financial commitment.
- 98 of those pledges were increased over 2024-25.
- There were 17 new or reinstated pledges.

We raised \$359,582 toward our goal of \$366,000! Thank you, everyone! We were able to give the staff a modest 2% increase and meet some of the inflationary costs to the church because of the love and generosity of our members and friends. While some expenses beyond our control increased,

our total expense budget is about \$4,000 less than in 2024-25. We didn't budget as much for choir expenses and made painful decisions to cut costs by making deep cuts to what we (1) share with the UUA (from whom we get so much) and (2) set aside for long-term property repairs.
